


Mummers' Parade

When we look for something in the vein of entertainment, we largely look for those things most appealing to the senses, such as, beauty, the spectacular, comedy, thrills, novelty and music. It is readily seen that the world famous Mummers' Parade abounds in these component parts that spell entertainment. The three divisions of the parade—Comic—Fancy and String Band offer a variety that would captivate any audience.

COMIC

The Comic Division offers us clever portrayals of social and political satire, famous cartoon and comic strip characters to delight the children, and clowns and impersonators to delight all the young in heart. The comic division, as the name implies, supplies the comedy for the parade. These men who make you laugh on New Year's Day gather their ideas from every source imaginable and some of their results surpass all feats of ingenuity. Anyone in public life who makes headlines at any time during the year can be certain of being burlesqued in the Mummers' Parade. To the men in the Comic Division goes the distinction of being the originators of the New Year's Day Parade. The idea of Mummery can be traced back to times, B. C., but it has always been in the trend of comedy and satire. The other divisions did not come about until a much later date. History will give evidence of great revelry among the early settlers of our country taking place around the Christmas and New Year Holidays with men dressed in odd clothes and darkened faces shooting guns and making a great deal of noise.

FANCY

Sometime in the late 19th century the Fancy Division came into existence with its massive capes and suites. Every one who sees the suits of the Fancy Division is held in awe. Their gigantic frames bedecked with glistening satin of

various colors and trimmed with marabou and sequins of equal magnificence. There are brigades of men dressed in gorgeous costumes with huge feathery headdresses dancing to that old spiritual and theme song of the Mummers' Parade, "O Dem Golden Slippers"—also, there can be found female impersonators—gentlemen in reality—flaunting their charms all along Broad Street dressed in exquisite gowns and furs. The Captain's Cape, approximately 200 feet long and 75 feet wide and carried by about 60 pages and portraying a theme that is carried out on satins and brocades always draws great acclaim from the spectators. The handsome costumes and the trio suits will delight everyone when the men dance up Broad Street, with the shimmering sun besparkling their costumes to the strains of Dixieland jazz.

STRING BAND

Now we add the final ingredient to make up the gayest festival the world over—the Mummers' Parade. The newest addition to the parade—the String Band Division—has without a doubt proven its worth as a member of this time honored institution. The novel music of the String Bands is unequalled. People the country over come to hear the lilting rythm of a String Band. The costumes of a String Band are based on a certain theme and then the music and drills are designed to coincide with this chosen theme and the net result is superb entertainment for all. Each String Band Captain leads his band up Broad Street strutting and dancing in his own inimitable style and arrayed in a costume that would outdo a Broadway production. The String Bands have added another innovation to their repertoire of pleasantries—that of singing as they march along. This has been received with great delight by those who have witnessed it. There is great rivalry among the String Bands and the competition for the most beautiful costumes is most keen.
