





1982 Philadelphia Mummers' String Bands' Hall of Fame



TOM A. HOWLEY

January 1, 1982 will mark Tom A. Howley's 52nd march up Broad Street—quite a respectable record for a man in his mid-fifties. You see, Tom was carried in his first parade in 1930 as a member of the old Silver Crown Fancy Club. After that first parade, he continued marching in the Fancy Division for more than 25 years. Following Silver Crown, he joined the club organized by his uncle S. D. Wheeler. In 1953, Tom became a member of the Hog Island Fancy Club and was captain for several years.

In 1957, Tom switched divisions, moving to the Ferko String Band. He was a featured performer in many of their prize-winning routines. Finally, in 1964, he made his last move—to the Hegeman String Band. From 1964 to 1976, Tom participated as an aid and mar-

shall. In 1976, following the death of the band's longtime leader Alfred Fink, Tom was appointed captain. Since becoming captain, admittedly his "lifelong dream," he has won two prizes—in 1978 and 1981.

Tom's devotion to Hegeman isn't his only Mummers involvement. He has been the secretary of the Philadelphia Mummers Association for the past 16 years.

Special thanks go to Tom's devoted wife Dottie and his daughter Kathie. He says without their understanding he could not have given so much of himself to the hobby he loves. He also wants to thank all of his friends in the Mummers Association, and last, but certainly not least, all of the members of the Hegeman String Band who have supported him over the years.



JOSEPH L. BRESSET
Woodland String Band

Dedication, leadership and experience. These are just a few of the characteristics that qualify a man for the String Band Association Hall of Fame. Joe Bresset has demonstrated these traits throughout his tenure in mummery.

Joe (affectionately known as "Leo") began his string band career in 1940 and since then he has proven to be one of the pillars of the Woodland String Band. As an accomplished saxophone player Joe has greatly added to the overall musical quality of the band and even more generously has compiled a performance record illustrating his versatility.

Joe's been elected to the board of directors for 29 years. He served two years in the Office of Director; two years as Recording Secretary; and in 1953 led the Woodland String Band as Captain. (During that year Joe also assumed the duties of President and Chairman of the Board). Currently, he is serving in the Office of Mu-

sical Director a position held for 24 years.

Throughout these years Joe has also assumed the duties of Chairman to countless committees. Most responsibilities concern financial matters necessary for an organization to survive; fund nights, neighborhood collections, chance drives, Installation banquets, and similar lotteries. But Joe Bresset's most impressive credential is an intangible—charisma. Inner determination and outward drive mixed with an uncanny pleasant personality are leadership qualities that influence many band decisions.

While congratulating "Leo" on his selection to the Hall of Fame, we thank him for continued loyalty.

"MAN BEHIND THE SCENES"

The title "Man Behind the Scenes" describes an individual whose own willingness to contribute time and effort is equalled by an ability to be humble. He offers help without being asked and gives without expecting to receive. But above all, he will shy away from the spotlight declining the attention equivalent to those contributions. Toby Saunders is indeed an example of a "Man Behind the Scenes."

"Toby started his mumpers history with the 69th Street String Band (which later became known as the Harry Whitman String Band). This was followed by one year of membership in the Hegeman String Band. "Toby" then joined the Woodland String Band and has been an active member of our organization for thirty years. During this time has has served on


the Board of Directors for a total of 20 years being elected to various positions such as Drill Master, Office of Director, Music Director and most notably, the Office of Assistant Musical Director.

While his performance record is worthy of recognition "Toby" is also honored for other subtle contributions. He has always been an integral part of "hidden" band activities such as headpiece constructions and helping maintain band instruments and equipment. But "Toby" will always be remembered for one extraordinary accomplishment — that he taught more than fifty men to play the banjo! Many of them are still in the Woodland String Band; some are retired and some belong to other bands; but they will all recall "Toby's" willingness to teach them on his own "free-time," in his house, and without accepting compensation. This particular deed alone depicts "Toby" diligently working "Behind the Scenes" for the betterment of Woodland String Band and mumpers in general.

Presently "Toby" continues to serve the band unselfishly despite a recent illness. During the final months prior to New Years Day he might be found at the club sorting plumes or running necessary errands to get material for the headpieces and continues to do so without regard for recognition or reward.

The members of the Woodland String Band recognize "Toby's" talent, dedication and generosity. We wholeheartedly thank him for being one great "Man Behind the Scenes."

OLD TIMERS HALL OF FAME



JAMES J. KING

James J. King has been a dedicated mummer for 45 years.

King, 56, of Gloucester, N.J., began his musical career at age 11, with the Dixon String Band and went on to be a member of String Bands such as Hegeman, Garden State, Avalon, Durning, and South Philly.

King and his five sons now serve with various string bands.

As a last tribute to his great career, Jim King is the first person to be inducted into the hall of fame from a non-associated group—Garden State.





Theme: CANDY LAND DREAM

"Come on! those of you with a sweet tooth, the fondness for candy, you will follow Duffy as it makes its 1982 presentation of "Candy Land Dream".

Each of the bandsmen is colorfully dressed in a costume of bright pink satin and decorated with all the sweet "goodies" such as lollipops, peppermint sticks, ribbon candy and cotton candy.

The bandmen's trousers are flared and trimmed with white lace and decorated with red candy hearts and trimmed with red sequins. Their jackets are flared with one red and white striped sleeve and one green and white striped sleeve, representing peppermint sticks. The sleeve has an overlay of pink satin which drops behind the sleeve and is decorated with red hearts and trimmed with ribbon candy. A bib is worn over the jacket and is decorated with lollipops, peppermint sticks and trimmed with red sequins and ribbon candy. Their hats are also pink and trimmed with red sequins and topped with three cones of cotton candy.

Each player will carry a backpiece of white satin trimmed with red sequins and white chicken feathers and topped with lollipops, peppermint sticks and boxes of candy and white plumes.

Captain Henry J. Kunzig, Sr.—the oldest marching captain on Broad Street—is elegantly dressed in his costume of pale green and gold brocade decorated with gold and green lamé, as he represents the "candy man".

His headpiece is white satin decorated with large lollipops and peppermint sticks and trimmed with gold sequins and topped with over one hundred white plumes.

The band presents the story of a little girl who, after eating too much candy, is dreaming of being in a candy land filled with all kinds of candies. She is met by the candy man and his candy maker. As she sees the band of candy land characters marching toward her, large pieces of her favorite candies appear (the candy kiss, the lollipop, and peppermint sticks). Being fascinated by this, she dances after each one—tasting them. After all of this, her tummy is upset but they all join in a great dance finale as her dream fades.

For all of this, our Music Department has arranged and adapted such "goodies" and "sweet things" for your enjoyment as "Candy", "Candy Kisses", "The Good Ship Lollipop", "Peppermint Twist", "The Candy Man", "Cotton Candy and Toy Balloons", "Sugar Blues", and "Sugar in the Morning".



"HALLELUJAH! OLD-TIME REVIVAL "MEETING"

One of the most spirited events continually present in the history of America was the 'Revival Meeting.' Men, women and children would gather by the river-side to place their cares and woes in the hands of a preacher. The preacher would read from the "Good Book" preaching fire and brimstone.

People came to this event anyway they possibly could get there. Some rode horses and mules, in buggies, wagons and Model T Fords. Others even walked a great distance. The congregation would gather and a song leader would teach them to sing.

Afterwards, a preacher would come filling the air with spirit. Together, they would sing, shout, clap hands, stamp feet and bang tambourines. The preacher stood on a soap-box shaking his pointed finger to the heavens and people raised arms in praise.

Revival Meetings had different forms but all were similar in nature and shared the same purpose. For example, many communities only had one room schoolhouses. So the people would go into an open area, insert poles in the ground, nail 2 by 4's on top with branches and limbs over the framework. It was the peoples' way of building an "auditorium" that would be adequate for the crowds to attend. Sometimes sawdust was placed on the ground to help settle dust and an out-of-tune piano usually was present along with the song leader and preacher. These were the ingredients of a great "revival." The preacher felt it would be the greatest way to win people to God because: "Music would till the soil and Preaching would sow the seed . . .

... Brothers and Sister gather round
 We're gonna put some life in this town
 Every little girl and boy
 Clap your hands and shout with joy
 Sing your soul and stamp your feet
 Down by the riverside we'll meet
 And there beside the running brook
 We'll sing the songs from that Good Book.

Yea, they were the good old days in spite of the weather, wind and dust, many thousands of people were won to God during this wonderful era. They began as early as 1900, continued into the 20's and 30's strongly touching the day we live. Woodland String Band intends to re-capture that celebration of joy and happiness.

... Lift your spirits and shout with praise
 It's time to change the evil ways."
 "HALLELUJAH!"

COSTUME

The mood and spirit of this event requires bright flashy colors. Tambourines are represented in the backpiece in sunburst acetate designs ringed by mirrors on the outer edges and silver discs. The color reflects from the light and the rhythm makes it look like the whole backpiece is having a revival of "That Old-Time Religion."

The hat is the black hat of a preacher man. The curved lapel is done in blue, applicated in sequins, outlined by gold. The white collar has a gold sunburst with overlays of acetate to give a fiery stand up and be revived good Old-Time Religion look.

The sleeve is puffed with a rubbed garter holding it up. Gold lamé bursts forth from the garter. Underneath is a cuffed sleeve that snaps at the end to illustrate what the preacher would wear with a good dress shirt. The waist piece resembles a vest done in black sequins outlined in gold.

The pants are blue with a striped sequin down one side. They flair at the bottom with sunburst pleating and acetate with ribbons cascading not only off the garter but also the side of the pants.

SONG LEADER SELECTIONS

"Amazing Grace," "Old-Time Religion," "Down By the Riverside," "At a Georgia Campmeeting," "Swing Low Sweet Chariot," "Jericho," "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands," "Hallelujah! Come On Get Happy," "Amen" and "Sing Hallelujah!"

PRESENTATION

The band recaptures the revival meeting event. Following a moment of prayer and grace the congrega-

tion will stroll to the "Riverside" with echoes of "Old-Time Religion." At the "Campmeeting" the gathering invokes in some good and evil activities waiting there for a call to order.

Music will help everyone recall the Fall of Jericho and other miracles symbolizing the power of God. The preacher reprimands the sinful for their evil ways. After repent the entire congregation will join in a celebration of rejoice. Clap, shout, sing, stamp your feet and bang those tambourines. "Hallelujah! Come On Get Happy." Faith has once again been restored. "AMEN."



MEMORIAL

Woodland String Band is dedicating its 1982 theme presentation in memory of William J. "Billy" Peacock who died of cystic fibrosis on January 12, 1981. He was 20 years old. Billy's legend is a living example of perserverance, courage and strength.



COSTUMES

Breast plates, epaulettes, and other displays enhance the realism and glitter of these costumes. 9 musicians wear large "Tubas" as backpieces supporting the university band effect.






Theme: "GOLDEN MEMORIES OF THE BOWERY"

I remember the tales that my grandfather told me, as we often walked along the streets of Philadelphia; tales of love, tales of war, and tales of his childhood

during the lusty tumultuous years of the late 1890's. But most of all I remember my grandfather's story of the days when he was a newsboy on Broadway, and of a bunch of guys called FERKO, and their "GOLDEN MEMORIES OF THE BOWERY". As we would walk down Second Street, the cradle of Philadelphia's famed Mummies, he would often reminisce

"In the 1890's, Broadway was THE place to be, the promenade in Old New York. Everybody rich and poor, young and old alike, came to Broadway, and its sister street, "THE BOWERY". How "I'D GIVE THE WORLD TO SEE THAT OLD GANG OF MINE"; the shoeshine boy, the toughie, the cop on the beat, and the kids playing crap. But, in those bygone days, one bunch stood out from all the rest. They were the original "BOYS FROM THE BOWERY", brothers to the very end, known as FERKO. They hailed from Philadelphia I hear, but when they walked the "STREETS OF OLD NEW YORK" every New Yorker stepped aside. And what a bunch of guys FERKO had. Those boys from 'Philly' brought a real touch of class to the Bowery. They danced up a storm, they played and raised Heck, and they sang, all to the tune of their "Happiest Music in the Bowery".

"And just when the fun would begin, Officer Bunky would show up, and try to restore his own brand of law and order, just as the noon edition would hit the streets."

"EXTRA! EXTRA! READ ALL ABOUT IT!! we'd holler as we'd sell the papers up and down Broadway. Then we'd all gather around the newsstand as FERKO would play and dance and we'd all raise a little more Heck, even old Officer Bunky, Yep . . . all of us guys on the Bowery wanted to be a part of that bunch from Old Philadelphia, called FERKO." "But FERKO never stayed too long. They were always movin' on. And wherever they took their "Happiest Music in the World", to the East Side, the West Side, Uptown or Downtown, they made "EVERY STREET A BOULEVARD IN OLD . . ."

I can still see the tears glistening in my grandfather's eyes as he finished his favorite story. Today, almost a century later, my grandfather's Bowery is but a fond fleeting memory; the streets of Philadelphia are a far friendlier place. My grandfather's eyes have forever closed to the world, but I'll never forget him, or that bunch from Old Philadelphia called FERKO and their "GOLDEN MEMORIES OF THE BOWERY".






