1993 Philadelphia Mummies' String Band Hall of Fame

This year's sole inductee into the String Band Hall of Fame is Joseph L. Brogan, Deputy Commissioner of Recreation for the City of Philadelphia. Joe, known by his friends as "The Brogue," is the first person elected without ever having been a member of a mummies organization.

A graduate of St. Joseph's Prep High School and St. Joseph's University, Joe has thirty three (33) years of service with the City in the Recreation Department.

Joe served as City Parade Coordinator for the 1981, 1982, 1983, and 1984 parades. He was the String Band Coordinator for the parades from 1985-1993. Mr. Brogan deserves a great deal of the credit for making the string band segment of the Mummies Parade the extravaganza that it is today. After the 1990 parade, Joe assisted the bands in the coordination and implementation of a new judging system and new criteria for the string band competition.

When Joe Brogan was given the parade assignment by then Commissioner Robert Crawford in 1980, he asked, "Who are these mummies and can I place my trust in them?" Working closely with administrators of Presidents Donaghy, Deighan, and Hee, the "Brogue" learned indeed who the mummies were and that he most certainly could trust them.

But Joe Brogan, trust is a two way contract and the mummies immediately knew that you were a man of trust, intelligence, vision, caring, and above all, unquestioned integrity! The result of this mutual admiration is a better parade and the mummies way of showing their special appreciation by bestowing this Hall of Fame honor upon you.

Joe Brogan, you have the respect, thanks, and congratulations of all Association Officers and all band members. Their hope is that you will always be there for them in some parade capacity.

1993 Philadelphia Mummies' String Old Timers' Hall of Fame

In 1920 a head-of-household made \$7.00 gross per week, a music lesson cost \$1.50 per hour and a violin cost \$50.00! In 1920 Frank Kohri's mother decided the cost was worth it, and Frank began playing the violin. In 1993, the Ferko String Band honors the effort, perseverance and contribution that Frank brings to Mummyery, and we honor Frank on his induction into the String Band Old Timers' Hall of Fame.

In 1922, Joseph Ferko formed the Ferko String Band, and in 1926 Frank Kohri stopped in the Ferko Drug Store at 5th and Glenwood and became one of the early members of "Ferko". Frank's first parade in 1927 saw Ferko win First Prize with the theme "Deck of Cards". And Frank's last parade as a playing musician in 1983 witnessed Frank out front playing his violin as one of four celebrated farmers connected with "All Aboard For Dixie" theme.

Frank Kohri today remains actively involved in the health and success of the Ferko String Band. Since 1975 Frank has held the position of Financial Secretary of the band. In addition to his years of playing, he has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Ferko String Band for many years, and attended all Board meetings from 1975 to the present in his role of Financial Secretary. His consistent presence at weekly rehearsals and band functions is a poignant reminder of the history and heritage of the Ferko organization and the success of the String Band Association in promoting the value of Mummyery.

The Old Timers' Hall of Fame is not for the average String Band Member. Frank Kohri's contribution to Ferko and Mummyery is far from average. His length of service alone is enough to demonstrate commitment

and devotion. But added to that is the level of active involvement: playing musician, Board Member and since 1975, Financial Secretary.

Even more important is that at 83 years of age, Frank Kohri still contributes and serves as a role model of what a gentleman, a mummy and string band member should be.

By his continued active participation in mummyery, Frank demonstrates that an individual can enrich an organization, its history and its members through quiet perseverance and contribution. Cecil B. De Mille, a person familiar with the grandeur and spectacle typical of a Mummy's parade, said:

The person who makes a success of living is the one who sees his goal steadily and aims for it unservingly. That is dedication.

Frank Kohri exemplifies what makes String Bands successful: commitment, integrity, free contribution of talent, time and effort to the enrichment of the organization and its members — in a word, dedication. The Ferko String Band thanks the String Band Association for recognizing Frank's contribution, and we thank Frank for the privilege of his friendship.

Led by a "houngan" (Captain Moyer), the worshippers work for the intense level of ritual needed to evoke the loa, the spirits comprised of both sweet and hot temperament. Like Voodoo itself, the music is a blend of cultures and rhythm. The band will play musical selections such as Santana's "Everybody's Everything," Iko, Iko, and Senora pound out Voodoo's Jamaican influence. Note the traditional pin dolls as Captain Moyer casts his spell on all. Finally the lively Wake Up heats up the ceremony to its final goal — group possession. Keep a watchful eye as the Zombies work their magic and the band disappears.

COSTUMES

The big backpiece band suit presents a Voodoo witch doctor. A Voodoo idol sits watching each player. The main dancers,

Voodoo spirits in bright orange, carry Voodoo body tattoo designs and a feathered headdress. The Zombies are easy to find, they sport yellow goo and outrageous facial makeup. Pit band members wear a ceremonial Voodoo suit marked by a caps coat and skull-topped headdress. Captain Moyer's suit is white with gold cleo sequins and features pants trimmed with orange and fuchsia feathers. Zombie designs and skulls adorn his waist.

His backpieceHis backpiece portrays an eruption of Voodoo spirits, marked with many hundreds of plumes shooting outward, each white plume shoot sets off with bursts of orange and fuchsia feathers. And always, the skull symbols that befit the houngan.



During the presentation, he will be stripped of these parts to take on the look of a supervising worker.
