Steve Highsmith is PHL17's Director of Community Relations, producer and host of PHL17's "In Focus" program, and host of special projects, such as the annual SugarHouse Casino Mummies Parade

on New Year's Day. Steve has broadcast the parade for more than 20 years.

Highsmith has been on the Philadelphia news scene since 1981, first serving as morning news anchor and news director of WCAU Radio and news anchor of the NJN Nightly News before joining

"Inquirer New Tonight" on WPHL-TV in 1994 as chief political correspondent and anchor. He also served as NBC10 political correspondent and host of NBC10@Issue from 2005 to 2013.

Highsmith has been honored by the National Association of Television Arts and Sciences, the Associated Press, the Radio and Television News Directors Association and the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters. In 2011, Steve was inducted into the Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame. He is also an inductee of the Philadelphia Mummies String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Active in the community, Steve serves as Treasurer of the Mummies Museum Board of Directors. He also is a member of the Boards of the Greater Philadelphia Cultural Alliance, CADEkids, and Love

The Mummies. He is a former member of Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Philadelphia, United Cerebral Palsy of Philadelphia, the Cabrini College Board of Trustees and the Board of Governors of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. Steve also is involved with other community and nonprofit efforts, such as the Philadelphia Children's Alliance, BuildABridge International, the Muscular Dystrophy Association, Special Olympics, the Hepatitis B Foundation, Inn Dwelling and other institutions.

Highsmith is a summa cum laude graduate of Cabrini College with a B.A. in English and Communications and attended the University of Notre Dame. He resides with his wife and two children in Bucks County.

Denny Palandro



The highest honor a Mummer in the String Band division can hope to achieve is to be inducted into the Philadelphia Mummies String Band Hall of Fame. The South Philadelphia String Band is proud and honored that our Captain, Denny Palandro has achieved

this milestone as he is amongst the 2014 inductees into the String Band Hall of Fame!

Denny's mummer roots date back to 1974 when he joined the Trilby String Band as a young saxophonist at the age of 14. He marched in his first parade with Trilby in 1975.

But as a young child from the Grays Ferry section of South Philadelphia, Denny remembers the band that practiced down the street from his childhood house, the South Philadelphia String Band as he would watch them parade around the neighborhood and dreamt of one day becoming a member. In 1978, Denny fulfilled his childhood dream, and he became a member of South Philly where he marched behind legendary String Band Captain and former Association President, Jimmy Donaghy. Denny joined

South Philadelphia alongside his lifelong friend, current band President and fellow String Band Hall of Famer, Jim Browne.

In 1982 Denny ventured out and he played an integral role in the reorganization of the Avalon String Band. Then in 1986 he followed another childhood dream and he became a member of the Fralinger String Band where he enjoyed many years of comradery, great friendships and award winning performances.

However, in the year 2000, Denny returned home to the band that has always held his heart, the South Philadelphia String Band and he brought back with him a new generation into the tradition, his son Denny Jr, who is a percussionist and a dancer with the band. Through the years has accepted leadership roles and he has served on various committees within the organization.

Today Denny continues to march with his brothers in the South Philadelphia String Band as the bands Captain. For that honor, he is truly thankful and forever grateful to his fellow members! All of the members of South Philly mean the world to him! He is a delegate to the association representing the South Philadelphia String Band and he also is currently the Vice President of the Philadelphia Mummies String Band Association, where he has the best interest of all the String Bands in mind as he

serves as a member of various committees, in a constant strive to help enhance and preserve, our great Mummies tradition.

Denny would like to recognize first, his parents, the late Josephine and Rocco Palandro for their encouragement and dedication in providing him with the opportunity to pursue his musical, and mummer dreams. But most of all, he thanks his wife of 31 years, Jeanne and his children, Lauren and Denny Jr. for their constant love, support, devotion and understanding throughout his 40 years of Mummery!

After over four decades of being a mummer, a saxophone player, serving as a theme committee member, a Captain, an association delegate, an association Rules Committee member, Parade Committee member and the Vice President of the String Band Association the members of the South Philadelphia String Band in thanking the String Band Association for accepting our nomination, we proudly salute and congratulate our Captain, Denny Palandro on his well-deserved induction into the Philadelphia Mummies String Band Hall of Fame!

Bob Schuhl



It is with great pride, honor and appreciation that the Hegeman String Band congratulates Robert "Bob" Schuhl as a member to the 2014 Philadelphia Mummies' String Band Association (PMSBA) Hall of Fame.

Although Bob's time spent in mummery has not always been with an association band, his overall contribution to our great institution is what merits this high honor.

Bob's first strut up Broad Street as a mummer was in 1950. This year marked Bob's 64th year in the parade and 37th year with the Hegeman String Band. He originally began his well-established career as a mummer with the Palmyra String Band. A gift of a 4-string guitar from his father gave him a spot playing with the band. In a short time, he graduated to a banjo provided to him by the band's music director. After a stint in the US Navy, Bob returned to the hobby and played with three other South Jersey string bands: Pennsauken, Berlin and Garden State.

In 1967, Bob, along with his friend Russ Figueroa,

joined the Hegeman String Band. In his tenure at Hegeman, Bob's tireless dedication had him actively participating as a member of the music committee and eventually leading the band as its drill master.

In 1981, Bob left Hegeman to share his passion with his family by joining a co-ed band, the South Jersey String Band. Bob became the Captain of South Jersey and was awarded 2nd Prize Captain with his presentation of their theme, "Cats". Bob earned his prize without the use of a back-piece, which at the time, was unheard of. Bob participated with South Jersey until its merger with Palmyra String Band.

In 1991, Bob returned to Hegeman with his wife Joni whom he met in the South Jersey String Band. Joni, like Bob, is an accomplished musician and plays banjo and guitar. In addition to Joni, her brother Albert "Allie" Geiser also joined Hegeman. In 1993, Allie passed away and Bob and Joni took a leave to establish a memorial band to Allie, the Berlin String Band. After a two-year strut, they reunited with Hegeman.

In addition to banjo, Bob plays mandolin, bass fiddle and guitar. Bob's hobbies include collecting old instruments and wood working. He has refurbished many instruments for fellow mummies. Bob also has provided music lessons on string bass and banjo.

Bob also has a mastery of most, if not all songs and can be heard on many nights after music rehearsals "jamming" and entertaining members and their guests with his spirited vocals. Bob is one of Hegeman's "resident vocalists" and is relied on at the band's concerts to further entertain the audience.

Bob is truly an ambassador of mummery. He is passionate about his hobby and will go out of his way to entertain the young and the old. It's not uncommon to see Bob walking around before or after band jobs singing and playing a tune. A smile from his captive audience is his reward for his effort. Bob understands that for our hobby to live on, it must do so through our youth. He ensures that the young members of the band understand the history of our hobby and makes it his duty to share his musical talents with everyone he meets.

At previous Show of Shows, when you hear a banjo and a joyful voice, Bob Schuhl is the face you will always see nearby. He enjoys his "jam" sessions with his fellow mummies and if there are written lyrics, Bob will know them and share them. Please remember what Bob has done and continues to do to further represent what being a mummer is all about. We hope you appreciate his continued contribution to mummery.

His Mummers Mission: Keep the Flame Burning. It was 1996 and one Philadelphia institution, a collection of Mummers String Bands, was saying farewell to another city treasure, the venerable-but-crumbling Philadelphia Convention Hall hard by the Schuylkill River. The occasion was the closing performance of the

annual "Show of Shows" featuring the costumed and plumed musicians just as they appeared in the January first Mummers Parade. The bands would leave this show to carry their musical tradition into a new century, but the majestic and cavernous hall would soon succumb to the wrecking ball.

In the Greater Kensington String Band dressing area, a TV crew approached a solidly built man wearing costume pants, an accordion on his chest and a greasepaint mustache over his smile. What, a crewman asked, did he find so important about this show and Mummery?

"I enjoy the fellowship of the band members and I enjoy seeing the young kids come into the band and developing," said Ed Weisser. "They start young and they become Mummers."

Although he was well into middle age, Edward O. Weisser knew exactly how the excitement of Mummery tasted to the teenaged musicians generously sprinkled throughout the hall that day. He was just nine years old when he hoisted his accordion into a rehearsal of the old Pennel String Band to begin his string band career. Sixty-eight years later, Ed continues to savor the

incomparable thrill of playing music with his buddies, young and old, as they entertain crowds large and small.

There are few Mummers who spread the testament of the Mummer's Life as widely and as enthusiastically as Greater Kensington's newest member to be installed in the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Hall of Fame. The timeline of Ed Weisser — school teacher, Bucks County businessman, leader in the Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons in Pennsylvania — is accompanied by a string band soundtrack that is projected to all who know him. He especially wants the kids to hear that tune.

When Greater Kensington played several parades on the Ocean City boardwalk last summer, his oversized SUV was called into duty to transport the restless, gangly teenage members. No problem for Ed. After the return trip, Ed was impressed. "I stopped at a fast food place because they were hungry and let them order what they wanted. The kids were very respectful and did not try to take advantage. These are good kids."

Sharing the wholesome string band experience and the responsibilities of adulthood comes natural to Ed. He earned a Master of Education degree from Temple University and was a teacher for 11 years in the Neshaminy School District. He served as a role model in the Big Brother organization for more than a decade. He has served in teacher-related positions for the and the Free Masons.

(Ed's Masonic leadership culminated with his election as the Right Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Pennsylvania for the years 1996 and 1997. As Grand Master, Ed set the cornerstone for the Shriner's Hospital for Children. Ed is also an active member of the Lu Lu Temple String Band.)

Plenty of other Mummers know of the Weisser generosity. During many years as a Greater Kensington officer (President, Treasurer, Trustee, and Business Manager, his current role), Ed created a wide network of string band peers and always sought opportunities to assist his counterparts in other bands. He's arranged transfers of band jobs, instruments and know-how, and many in Mummery know Ed as a resourceful and generous brother.

Ed has consistently volunteered his time, experience and wisdom to serve many aspects of our unique tradition. His many years of service include a stint as treasurer of the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association.

Ed likes to tell the string band story to any and all of the audiences he faces, whether it be during a small band job or at the dais in front of hundreds of Masons at events up and down the East Coast. As a volunteer speaker, Ed provides a positive depiction of mummery to people unfamiliar our musical culture, with an emphasis on youth involvement, fellowship, charity, history, and of course, the music.

Greater Kensington has twice recognized Ed with the annual Outstanding Officer Award. He has been named a Gold Card lifetime member of GKSB. Most recently, Ed joined such respected members of Greater Kensington as Joe Deighan, Ron Moyer, and Bob Dicks as they all became inaugural honorees in the Greater Kensington String Band Howard Peoples' Hall of Fame.

Ed appreciates the honors and accepts them with a smile. What keeps him going, though, is the rhythm of the band. It's all about playing the next tune. Performing in the next show. And helping the next kid who wants to become a Mummer.

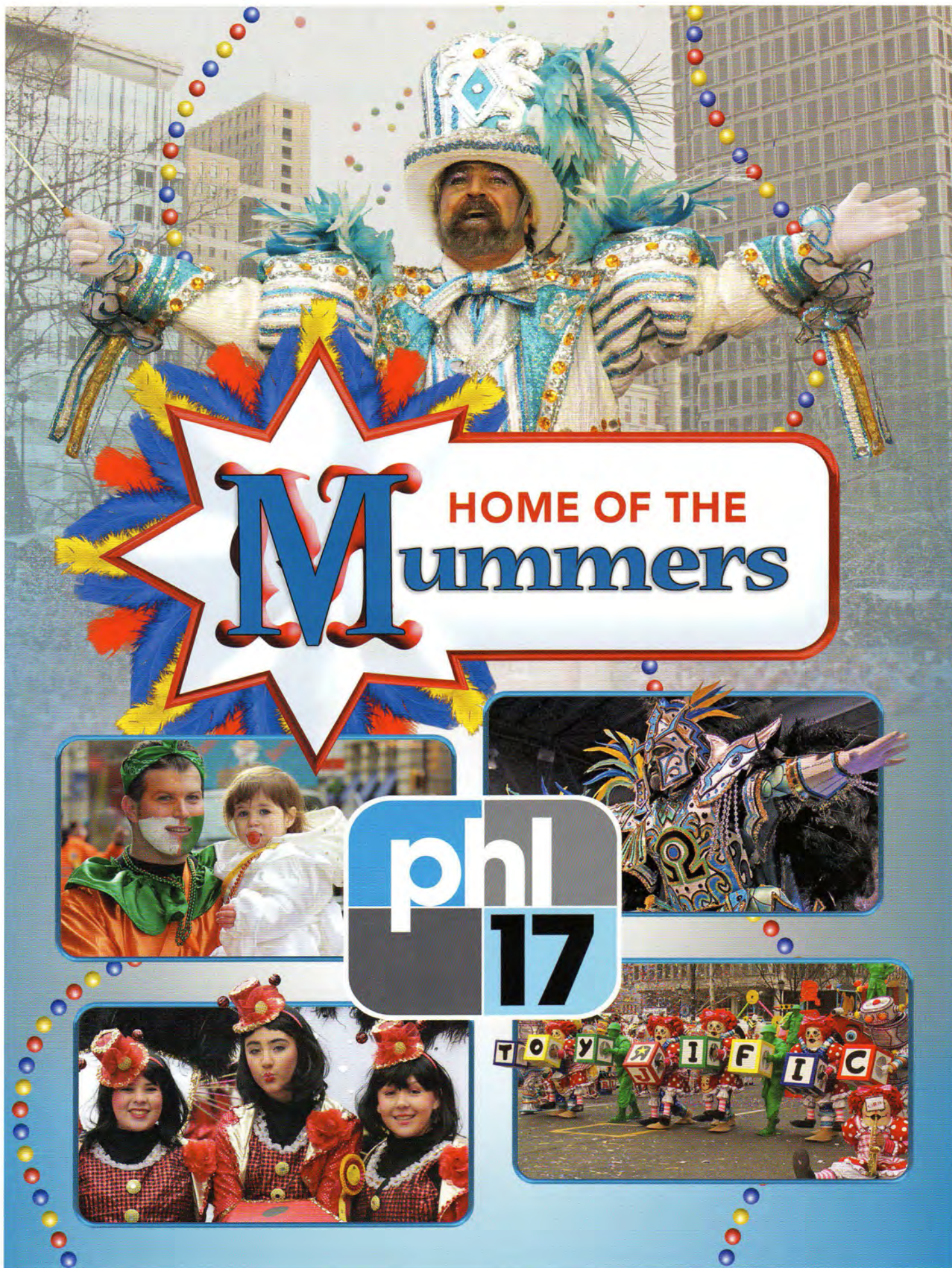

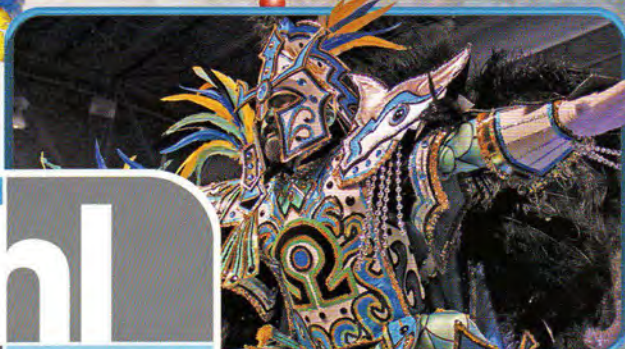

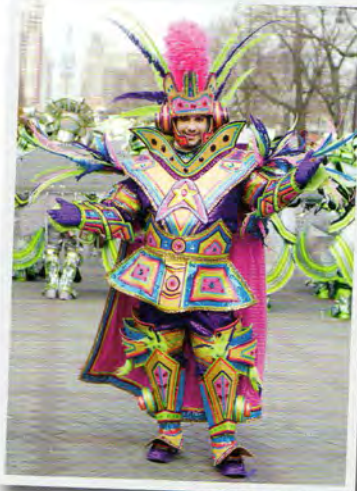
"Aqua Shoots For The Stars"

A mum version of Over the Waves, which is then laced with Drunken Sailor and Alabama Jubilee. Then a classical transition into a banjo, accordion, and violin/viola feature on Brahms Hungarian Dance No. 4. Following that, the baritone and bass sax are featured on a verse of In the Hall of the Mountain King. The melody is then traded to the tenors for two verses. Then there is a drum break, which segues into Palladio by Karl Jenkins layered with a minor version of Norwegian Wood, which leads into a verse of a dark and powerful Norwegian Wood. The arrangement concludes with a series of full chords accompanied with an underlying Ride of the Valkyries.

Led by their courageous Captain, "Eric the Red" this battle regiment dances and plays their way across the lands. The dark

worn eyes piercing through locks of thick, knotty beards wearing the memories of death and destruction seen in their raids across many lands..... It is their obsession of the skulls of their enemies that symbolize their ruthless pursuit of treasure and fortune. In this case, a musical tribute of dance and precision replaces the struggles of war as this celebration bridges humor with serious frames of prideful tributes to their history. A modern take on the Viking's 400 year history carefully crafted into a 4 1/2 minute show. Their initial ascent born upon their crests in the waves of their journey across the seas, is forgotten quickly in the flames of destruction that dance upon the finale of their victories of their enemies lands.

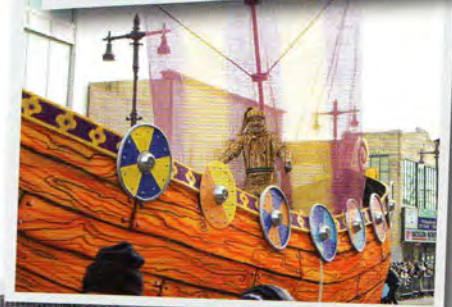

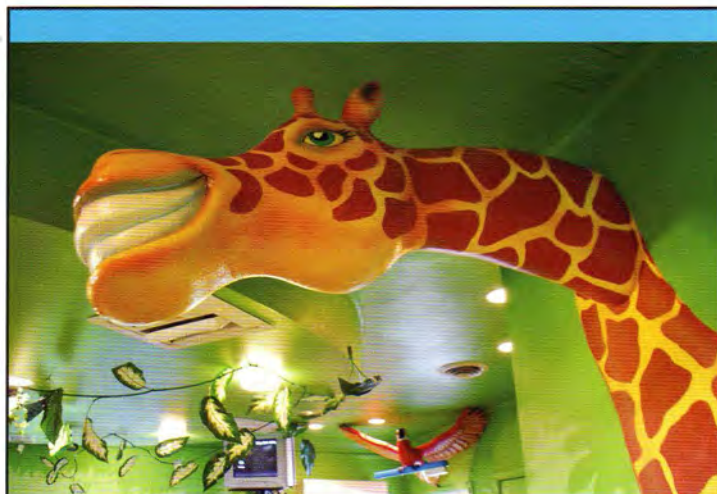

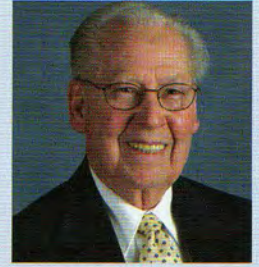
