


#### Steve Highsmith

Steve Highsmith is Vice-President of Institutional Advancement at Cabrini University in Radnor, Pennsylvania. He leads a department working with staff, faculty, students, alumni, trustees and the wider

community of citizens to raise awareness, friendship and fundraising to achieve the mission of Cabrini.

He is a former Director of Community Relations and Local Programming at PHL17-TV, producer and host of PHL17's "In Focus" program, and host of special projects, such as election specials and the annual Mummers Parade on New Year's Day. Steve has broadcast the parade for 25 years.

Steve arrived on the Philadelphia news scene in 1981, first serving as morning news anchor and news director of WCAU Radio (CBS) and news anchor of the NJN Nightly News before joining "Inquirer New Tonight" on WPHL-TV in 1994 as chief political correspondent and anchor. He also served as NBC10 political correspondent and host of NBC10@Issue from 2005 to 2013. His reporting credits include the Reagan-Gorbachev Summit, several national political conventions, and the visit of Pope Francis to Philadelphia. He has been honored by the National Association of Television Arts and Sciences, the Associated Press, the Radio and Television News Directors Association and the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters. In 2011, Steve was inducted into the Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame. He is also an inductee of the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Active in the community, Steve serves as Treasurer of the Mummers Museum Board of Directors. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of CADEkids and Love The Mummers. He is a former member of the Boards of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Philadelphia, United Cerebral Palsy of Philadelphia, and the Greater Philadelphia Cultural Alliance, as well as a former member of the Cabrini University Board of Trustees and the Board of Governors of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. Steve also has been involved in supporting other community and nonprofit efforts, such as the Philadelphia Children's Alliance, Inn Dwelling, and Special Olympics.

Highsmith is a summa cum laude graduate of Cabrini University with a B.A. in English and Communications and attended the University of Notre Dame. He resides with his wife, Jayne, in Bucks County.

# 2018 Hall of Fame Inductees

#### Harry Brown, Jr.



Quaker City String Band's motto is "Class, Pride & Commitment". Like every successful organization, Quaker City is comprised of members that are vital to their growth and prosperity. No member is more crucial to the achievements of Quaker City than Harry Brown, Jr. Harry embodies

"Class, Pride & Commitment" and the men of the Quaker City String Band are proud to submit him as our nominee for the String Band Association's Hall of Fame.

Harry Brown, Jr. joined Quaker City in August of 1976. At the age of 11 and a saxophone student of John Mayer, he was able to parade alongside his father. Harry Brown, Sr. had been a member of Quaker City since 1962 and a mummer since 1944. Harry Brown, Jr. has participated in 41 parades with Quaker City. He was elemental in 12 first place finishes and Quaker City placed in the top 3 more than 75% of the parades Harry took part in. Three of the 12 championship announcements came from Harry, himself. Harry has devoted his time as the President of Quaker City String Band since 2005. Prior to being president, Harry served Quaker City as Administrative Vice President for 4 years, Financial Secretary for a total of 7 years and has been a member of the Officers & Board of Directors since 1987. That is 30 years of leadership dedication enthusiastically bestowed to the Quaker City String Band.

Harry has been integral in the origination of numerous fundraising efforts within Quaker City. He has also served on disparate committees at the

behest of the String Band Association. These committees include the New Year's Day Parade committee and Show of Shows committee. Harry's most recent accomplishment, to pile onto the other tasks he undertakes, was to oversee the successful refurbishment of Quaker City String Band's clubhouse. The exterior renovation was completed at the tail end of 2016 under Harry's constant guidance.

Prior to and during Quaker City's renovation, Harry was quoted as saying the clubhouse needed to be fixed, "not only for us but for our families and Quaker City's future." Harry now parades alongside his son, Shane Brown, and the tradition continues. Harry is an exemplary mummer, leader, father, brother, son and friend to all he meets. Harry is a true manifestation of "Class, Pride & Commitment" and his induction into the String Band Association's Hall of Fame is certainly fitting for a man of his character. Quaker City can think of no one who personifies what it means to be a mummer and cannot conceive a person more deserving of this distinguished honor.

### Charles R. (Poppy) Graser



For seven decades, over sixty years, Chuck Graser was an active, string band mummer. He put on his first string band costume with the Aqua String Band for the 1949 parade, when Harry Truman was President and prior to the Korean War. Chuck then continually remained active through the many years as a musician until his last costumed parade in 1993. Undaunted, he continued into the 21st Century

as a marshal with Fralinger. Through seven decades he marched with the Aqua, Broomall, Greater Kensington, Westmont and Fralinger String Bands. In 1998, along with legends Bill Bowen, Sr. and Harry Rivell, Chuck Graser was inducted as a "Distinguished Retired Member" of the Fralinger String Band. The man was that greatly loved and respected.

Along the way in his intrepid and beloved adventure with string bands, Chuck encouraged his three sons, Chuck, Brian and Scott, to follow in his footsteps as musicians in the String Band Division, Subsequently

he was joined by four grandsons active in string bands, with Chuck, Jr. and Ryan parading with Woodland and Justin and Sean in Quaker City, and a fifth grandson, Kyle, who marches with the Comics. This is an incredible and marvelous family dynasty of string band mummers, all attributed to the patriarch. Chuck Graser, their Poppy who never stopped advocating for all string bands. Chuck always said String Bands and Mummery would teach his sons and grandsons respect, commitment and a wonderful family atmosphere that only this social culture can provide. This is a family of nine, quality and dedicated string band and mummers enthusiasts, led into the String Band Society by an amazing father and grandfather.

There is much to consider when elevating a person into the very respected and hallowed String Band Hall of Fame. Most inductees are legendary because of their status as leaders, Captains or Directors and some because of their dedication, quality, long term devotion and contribution to the art and craft of string bands. Chuck Graser is the latter, active with his string bands to the end and an individual who was part of the fabric and backbone of this wonderful society of mummers as a costumed musician and a working marshal. Even though he officially retired in 1993 he never stopped contributing to the string band effort, inside and outside the bands. Into the 21st Century he was working for his band as a marshal, video-taping and editing parades and concerts, providing copies to all bands, free of charge. Chuck was an entertainer who loved spreading the cheer of Mummery to all he met, and a consummate gentleman who happily represented string bands to all who watched. In the end we are blessed to have seven decades of string band devotion wrapped in the memory of this one gentle man. Chuck Graser is a man we all wanted to march beside.

The officers and members of the Fralinger String Band, with all respect to the Aqua, Greater Kensington and Broomall String Bands, are proud to nominate Charles R. Graser for induction into the String Band Hall of Fame.

His musical talent is always a welcome addition to our gigs and he is quick to pick up his tenor or tuba and get involved in a jam session.

Prior to the Uptown String Band, Bob was a member of the Harrowgate String Band. Bob first joined the Harrowgate string band in 1973. He has not only contributed musically to the band, for over forty years, but also in many other ways. Bob was crucial in assisting the Harrowgate String Band purchase Uptown's charter in 1991, which brought the two bands together. At that pivotal time, his financial backing was incredibly generous and assisted to make the band we have today possible. Throughout the many years as a member, he has always been willing to step up and give his time and talent to the band in any capacity possible.

Bob was born in Philadelphia and is currently retired and lives in Huntingdon Valley, PA. When Bob is not doing jobs with the band he spends his time with his lovely wife, Kathy and daughter Julia. He also is the organist and treasurer at the First Mennonite Church of Philadelphia. It's not surprising that Bob is an Eagle scout and willing to give his time to many charitable causes. 
### Thomas Vasile: Fralinger's Man Behind the Scene

The membership and service of Tom Vasile to his Fralinger String Band is of many features, that of administrative, constructive, creative and personal contributions to his organization. As a professional Tom is a pharmacist, a graduate of Temple University College of Pharmacy. This

makes him the third pharmacist in the history of Fralinger, the first two being the founders of 103 years ago, Dr. John J. Fralinger and Joe Ferko who were both graduates of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy. Now a member of Fralinger for 27 years, Tom Vasile has served 7 terms as a member of the Board of Trustees and is always involved in prop construction. Presently, and for the last 10 years, he has been the Chief Marshal and garage manager. This pharmacist is both a Fralinger administrator and blue collar worker, and has been for a long time. Like the hundreds of marshals and behind the scenes members of all string bands, Tom's labors and contributions go unnoticed to all but the members of his band. Yet, Fralinger would never get onto the street without the efforts of Tom Vasile and such individuals. Tom Vasile is married to Arleen McDowell and is the son-in-law of Fralinger legend, Bill McDowell, Sr. Tom and Arleen have two children and son Tommy is a Fralinger member. Before his death, another Fralinger legend, 83 year old Frank Carbone would get to the Fraiinger Club every Tuesday evening and the occasional Sunday afternoon because Tom Vasile would drive from his home in South Philadelphia to pick up Carbone at his residence in West Philadelphia as Frank was unable to drive, and then drive Frank back home.

We all look upon the success of a string band when we view the costumed musician performance. But behind the curtains, behind the scenes, are members like Tom Vasile who work so diligently throughout the year to assist the band at band jobs and preparing the annual band performance with the construction of props and scenery. 

At the time of his death, Teddy was the longest continuously active Captain on Broad Street and one of the longest tenured in all of string band history. For the past several years, Teddy shared the street with his young son, Jake, who will now succeed his father as the newest Captain of Duffy String Band.

In 2005, Teddy was inducted into the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association Hall of Fame. In 2009, he was awarded 6th prize Captain, the highest of his career, though he was always Number 1 to us.

The members of Duffy String Band thank Teddy for his leadership and, more so, his friendship. We are devastated by his loss and we dedicate our 2018 performance in his honor.

# **Hegeman String Band**

### "Sounds of Silence"

Hegeman String Band is one of the oldest of 18 string bands which comprises the string band division of Philadelphia's famed Mummer's Parade, a tradition with all its pageantry,

color, music and excitement dating back to the mid 1600's.

The band, which was organized November 2, 1920 by music store owner Ernest A. Hegeman, has taken top honors in the String Band Division ten times and has only finished outside the coveted top ten winning positions eleven times, compiling one of the best winning records in the history of the parade.

In May of 1991, for the first time, Hegeman opened its doors to female membership. Although women have paraded in some string bands since the early seventies, Hegeman made Mummer history on January 1, 1992 by becoming the first string band to capture the championship with female participants.
