Steve Highsmith is Vice-President of Institutional Advancement at Cabrini University in Radnor, Pennsylvania. He leads a department working with staff, faculty, students, alumni, trustees and the wider community of citizens to raise awareness, friendship and fundraising to achieve the mission of Cabrini.

He is a former Director of Community Relations and Local Programming at PHL17-TV, producer and host of PHL17's "In Focus" program, and host of special projects, such as election specials and the annual Mummers Parade on New Year's Day. Steve has broadcast the parade for 25 years.

Steve arrived on the Philadelphia news scene in 1981, first serving as morning news anchor and news director of WCAU Radio (CBS) and news anchor of the NJN Nightly News before joining "Inquirer New Tonight" on WPHL-TV in 1994 as chief political correspondent and anchor. He also served as NBC10 political correspondent and host of NBC10@Issue from 2005 to 2013. His reporting creditation of NBC10@Issue from 2005 to 2013. His reporting creditation of NBC10.

He has been honored by the National Association of Television Arts and Sciences, the Associated Press, the Radio and Television News Directors Association and the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters. In 2011, Steve was inducted into the Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame. He is also an inductee of the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Active in the community, Steve serves as Treasurer of the Mummers Museum Board of Directors. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of CADEkids and Love The Mummers. He is a former member of the Boards of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Philadelphia, United Cerebral Palsy of Philadelphia, and the Greater Philadelphia Cultural Alliance, as well as a former member of the Cabrini University Board of Trustees and the Board of Governors of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. Steve also has been involved in supporting other community and nonprofit efforts, such as the Philadelphia Children's Alliance, Inn Dwelling, and Special Olympics.

Highsmith is a sum ma cum laude graduate of Cabrini University with a B.A. in English and Communications and attended the University of Notre Dame. He resides with his wife, Jayne, in Bucks County.


I would like to congratulate the 2019 String Band Champion, the Quaker City String Band, and also offer



2019 Hall of Fame Inductee

Jim Muller



The Quaker City String Band is proud to nominate for membership in the String Band Hall of Fame Jim Muller Sr, a 44-year member of Quaker City String Band.

Jim began his career in mummery 1960 with the Hammond Comic Club and in 1972 he joined the Jokers New Year Brigade. He carried a costume for 3 years with the Jokers before joining Quaker City in 1975 as a banjo player. During Jim's playing career he strived to make himself a better banjo player while working a full-time job and raising a family. To this day, Jim is recognized as one of the finest banjo players in the String Band Association although he would never verbally agree to that status.

Throughout Jim's career in Quaker City he had the honor of serving as a Board of Director, Financial Secretary and Drill Master. In 1985, under his drill direction, Quaker City presented "A Scarecrow's Hayday" and took first place. In 2000, Jim was elected to the office of President of the organization, a position he held for 5 years. Jim had the honor of announcing first prize to the band 3 out of his 5 years as President. Jim also held the position of Vice President in 2007.

Jim worked for the City of Philadelphia for over 30 years starting out as a city mechanic for the Philadelphia Police Department. Jim ended his career as the City's Fleet Managing Director. While holding this position Jim interacted with all city departments including the Recreation Department. His connection to the Recreation Department enabled Jim to work with the Parade Directors and provide support where needed for both the City and the String Band Association. Jim's support played an integral role in the success of the parade for all String Bands up until his retirement from the City. He was and still is always willing to help any organization.

Like many of our fellow mummers, this has been a family affair for Jim. His wife Eleanor has sewn many suits for the comics and other parade divisions as well as Quaker City String Band's Color Guard. His two sons, Jimmy & Danny, are both members of Quaker City.

Jim represents not only Quaker City but the entire String Band Association at many charity events. He has performed for the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Assisted Living Facilities, Mums for Mutts and the Veterans Administration. His exceedingly talented banjo playing and personality brings smiles to many faces.

It is an honor for the Quaker City String Band to have Jim Muller Sr's name entered into nomination for the String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Those who know Joe know he will not be happy to have been acknowledged in this manner as he is the very definition of, a "Man behind the scenes". Joe has also brought his two sons into the band and both are accomplished saxophone players. His oldest son Scott who is the true definition of a "Chip off the old block" and at times the bane of Joe's existence, is following in his father's footsteps and taking on some of the jobs his father has done. NO ONE can possibly do all of the jobs Joe has held in the club. There are actually three members filling those jobs today with most likely a fourth joining that team as the three currently doing it just cannot get it all done in the manner Joe had in the past. Joe has fought many health issues these past years, but nothing was able to stop him from doing his jobs. Through his ongoing treatment Joe still completed all of his tasks. We have no idea where the club would be today if Joe Greco had not walked in the doors to Anderson Hall back on October 20, 2002.


For all these reasons and so many more we the members of the Woodland String Band are honored to name Joe Greco as our "Man behind the scenes".
