

Steve Highsmith

Steve Highsmith is Vice-President of Institutional Advancement at Cabrini University in Radnor, Pennsylvania. He leads a department working with staff, faculty, students, alumni, trustees and the wider community of citizens to raise awareness, friendship and fundraising to achieve the mission of Cabrini.

He is a former Director of Community Relations and Local Programming at PHL17-TV, producer and host of PHL17's "In Focus" program, and host of special projects, such as election specials and the annual Mummers Parade on New Year's Day. Steve has broadcast the parade for 25 years.

Steve arrived on the Philadelphia news scene in 1981, first serving as morning news anchor and news director of WCAU Radio (CBS) and news anchor of the NJN Nightly News before joining "Inquirer New Tonight" on WPHL-TV in 1994 as chief political correspondent and anchor. He also served as NBC10 political correspondent and host of NBC10@Issue from 2005 to 2013. His reporting credits include the Reagan-Gorbachev Summit, several national political conventions, and the visit of Pope Francis to Philadelphia.

He has been honored by the National Association of Television Arts and Sciences, the Associated Press, the Radio and Television News Directors Association and the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters. In 2011, Steve was inducted into the Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame. He is also an inductee of the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Active in the community, Steve serves as Treasurer of the Mummers Museum Board of Directors. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of CADEkids and Love The Mummers. He is a former member of the Boards of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Philadelphia, United Cerebral Palsy of Philadelphia, and the Greater Philadelphia Cultural Alliance, as well as a former member of the Cabrini University Board of Trustees and the Board of Governors of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. Steve also has been involved in supporting other community and nonprofit efforts, such as the Philadelphia Children's Alliance, Inn Dwelling, and Special Olympics.

Highsmith is a sum ma cum laude graduate of Cabrini University with a B.A. in English and Communications and attended the University of Notre Dame. He resides with his wife, Jayne, in Bucks County.

2020 Hall of Fame Inductee

James Buchakjian, Sr.



It is with great honor that the Durning String Band of Gloucester City, NJ sponsors Mr. James Buchakjian Sr. for the Hall of Fame for the class of 2019-2020. Jim is a dedicated member of our proud organization and we feel fits the exact qualifications for enshrinement.

James goes by many names to those of us who love him dearly. Mr. Buck, Jimmy Buck and Pop are just a few of the names he goes by. Jimmy is a true mummer having first started marching in 1950 with the Greater Overbrook String Band after his military service in the U.S. Navy. When he first started he primarily played violin but now he spends more time playing the banjo. If you ask him nicely though he will serenade you with the sweet sounds of the fiddle at any time. Some of our favorite times with Jimmy are when we sit around and jam and sing.

Jimmy is a tailor by trade and many of Jimmy's fondest memories are when he made costumes for the Greater Overbrook String, the Avondale Brigade and others in the Fancy Divisions of the parade. He can recall almost every suit he made during the 45+ years of costume design of which 10 years (1975-1985) was for the Greater Overbrook String Band. Jimmy loves to tell the story of his favorite costume he designed, an Elvis suit in 1977 where he took first prize in costume. You should see the smile he displays as he details the sequin and fine tailoring he applied to the making of the costumes. Jimmy proudly reminisces when he was interviewed on Channel 10 in 1977 for his design works on the Elvis costume he so adored.

Jimmy left the Greater Overbrook String Band after 35 years and went to the Ferko String Band where he spent one year. He then came to the Durning String Band in 1987 where he has been a member for the last 33 years. Even today at 94 years old Jimmy helps us with costume alterations, fabric selection and even making our captain's costume. Jimmy also plays with the Gloucester City "Old Timers" String Band keeping the mummer tradition alive. With the Durning String Band Jimmy has been an integral part of why we want to be mummers. He fosters an environment of enjoyment, dedication and simply put, everything we think of when you say "mummer".

For those of you not adding that makes 70 years of mummery experience. And there is no stopping him. He looks forward to every year. He always says, "As long as my knees hold up, I'll be on the street with my dancing shoes on and my instrument ready to play." In recent years Jimmy has taken on a spotlight role in our themes. This has been noticed by the broadcasters (Judge Jacob Hart and Steve Highsmith) as they wonder and talk about his role for the current year's theme. Radio DJ, Jacky Bam Bam, of WMMR will also talk about Jimmy on his show. The determination and drive that Jimmy has is an inspiration to us young'uns around him. He is the kind of person that you want not only as a member of your organization but most importantly as a friend.

It is for all of these reasons the members of the Board of Directors and the entire Membership of the Durning String Band nominate Mr. James Buchakjian Sr. for enshrinement in the Hall of Fame.

Thomas (Shaggy) Robison



Thomas (Shaggy) Robison joined the Woodland String Band on August 14, 1994 as a student alto sax player. His first year in costume with the band was January 1, 1996. From that date on his impact on the band has been one that has led him to become the ultimate leader. His fellow members saw the hard work and dedication and elected him to the office of club Vice President in January of 2000. Tom served in this roll through 2005.

In January 2005 he was elected to the position of Captain where he remained until retiring from this post in January 2019. In his 14 years as Captain, Tom became the most decorated Captain in the band's history. He won seven top five Captain's prizes in those years. Tom helped lead the band to its first ever championship on January 1, 2012 with our theme "It's a Jungle Out There."

While he served as Captain, Tom also remained on the Board of Directors serving as a Director-at-Large. Tom has a unique leadership quality and a humbleness about him that is true (and a bit odd at times) and this has always helped him connect with his fellow members. These leadership skills were always evident by the way Tom would readily step into line for parades and performances by playing saxophone or drums if that's what the band needed. He always found that being the band's Captain was a privilege and honor, but being a member is the ultimate thing to him.

Tom served as one of Woodland's delegates to the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association (PMSBA) for 21 years where he served on many committees ranging from Rules, Parade, Serenade and others. He was always ready to serve and did so with his usual honest and outward approach. It is for the reasons stated here, and many more, that we are proud to announce the induction of Thomas (Shaggy) Robison into the PMSBA Hall of Fame.

Angelo Lutz



The Philadelphia String Band Association is delighted to welcome Angelo Lutz as a 2020 inductee to the Hall of Fame. Angelo began his mummer career in 1978 when his uncle Charlie Cava introduced him to the Durning String Band. Angelo "joined as saxophone player" and quickly learned how to make backpieces, cut materials, and do all the things necessary to get the band to the parade New Year's Day.

After a few years, Angelo went on to join up with a group of men who left another band and in 1983 became a founding member of the reorganization of the Avalon String Band. There, he forged strong friendships, many of which have lasted to this day.

Over an almost 40-year span as a mummer, Angelo has been an invaluable member of many string bands: South Philadelphia String Band, Fralinger, Ferko, Broomall, Italian American, Greater Overbrook, and Hegeman. While Angelo is currently a non-playing member of the Hegeman String Band, he continues to be an integral part of the process and serves as a member on the Board of Directors.

Through the years Angelo has served many roles, some of which include Musician, Drill Master, Presentation Director, Theme Chairman. He has served on numerous committees and served as an officer in those bands over the years.

In 1996, as a member of the Italian American String Band, Angelo portrayed The Golden Buddha in their Presentation of Shang Hi Surprise. It was an unforgettable moment for

Italian American and a story hook that the media used over and over again. The next day Angelo's fully resplendent, bare-bellied image appeared on the front page of the Daily News. Within hours he was asked to call into the WIP Radio morning sports show during which Angelo accepted an offer to appear and compete in the Wing Bowl. There was one catch, he had to dress again as the Golden Buddha. Angelo, being the ultimate showman and promoter, brought the entire Italian American String Band and started a tradition that lasted some 20 years at wing bowl.

Angelo's true passion in life is cooking and at heart, nurturing. At his restaurant, Kitchen Consigliere Café in Collingswood, NJ you can find him seven days a week feeding the people with dishes he creates from his deep Italian roots and modern, fresh ingredients. Many of these dishes originated from the recipes he created back in 1983 when he began catering events for various string bands and other mummers' clubs. When he joined Hegeman, he met Paula "MOM" Pignotti. In those days there were two caterers in mummery, Mom Pignotti & Billy Schultz, who was the caterer to the Fralinger String Band. Today both are gone however, Angelo still provides mummery with Mom's great recipes and he is the caterer for Fralinger String Band and often called the modern-day Billy Schultz.

At Ronald McDonald House at Front and Erie in Philadelphia, Angelo combines his passion to nurture people with his love of music. He started a program bringing the String Band association to perform and serve food at least 5 to 6 times a year at the Front and Erie house. He freely gives to many organizations that ask for gift cards and donations throughout the year, but especially mummers organizations. His motto is "all you have to do is ask."

On January 2, 2019, tragedy struck Angelo and a dear friend he met when he joined up with the men of Avalon in 1983. A tragic car accident which took place in early hours of that morning claimed the young lives of three individuals and seriously injuring a fourth. One of the lives taken that morning was that of Denny Palandro Jr. Denny was the only son of Angelo's friend Denny Sr. he met back in 1983 when he joined Avalon. Since 1983 Angelo and Denny have had a unique friendship. They have always been there for each other. For many years, Angelo even dressed as Santa Claus on Christmas Eve for Denny's two young children the other being his daughter Lauren

Angelo loved bringing joy to all those he loved but now in the face of such a horrible tragedy, he didn't know how to stop the hurt that his friend and the other parents felt. He was compelled to turn that tragedy into a positive. He formed a foundation by which now in a positive way, we can all in remember, celebrate, and cherish the young lives taken too soon from us all.

Within 2 days of the accident, On January 4th Angelo founded and initiated The Palandro Ferry Memorial Foundation. Angelo made the initial deposit and The String Band Association joined him. Soon after, with some help from others, news about the foundation spread through social media and the donations began to pour in. Today the foundation has over 25 members and Angelo has been elected to serve as its first Chairman. Besides Angelo's total dedication to his business, he is committed to making the foundation a success for years in perpetuity.

The foundation's mission is to help and provide aid to all in the mummer community who may be in need or going through hard times. This includes assistance for medical bills, funeral expense or just ordinary day to day cost of living that may be unaffordable. The foundation has also endowed scholarships to the high schools of Kelly, Denny, and Joe. The foundation is committed to its mission to expand upon the tradition of the mummers, give back to the community and lead by example.
