Opening in the bicentennial year of 1976, the Mummers Museum, located at Second Street (2 Street) and Washington Avenue, stands in tribute to all Mummers ... past, present and future.


Dedicated to the Philadelphia celebration of the New Year, the museum houses a rich collection of mummers' paraphernalia and memorabilia, including spectacular costumes, a few of which date back to the turn of the 20th Century.

The Mummers Museum provides the visitor with a chronological progression of the Mummers Parade from a simple neighborhood celebration to a City sanctioned attraction drawing tens of thousands of spectators to the side-walks of Broad Street every New Year's Day, as well as a highly rated, vast local television audience.

Through exhibits and displays, a visitor can sense the commitment, dedication, sacrifice, creativity and talent of the men, women and children, from various backgrounds, who regard being a Mummers as a "way of life."

The museum offers an on-site gift shop, an on-line store and a banquet hall which is available for rental.

The museum conducts programs for both children and adults, and, free String Band concerts will be held this spring and fall.

2026 Hall of Fame Inductee

Joseph Pomante



Esteemed members of The Philadelphia Mummies String Band Association Hall of Fame Committee: Please allow me to present, on behalf of The Officers and Members of The James Durning String Band, our beloved Captain, Joseph Pomante for consideration to be inducted into The Philadelphia Mummies String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Joe, or Asti as he is affectionately known, started his Mummies career with The Aqua String Band in 1976. Asti marched with Aqua until after the 1978 parade. He then joined The Durning String Band after The Show of Shows in 1978 at the suggestion of our then music director Anthony D'Amore. Joe had been taking accordion lessons from Anthony and Anthony could see the tremendous talent and potential that Joe possessed.

In 1980, Joe took a leave of absence from the band when he enlisted in The United States Air Force to serve his country. After his honorable discharge, Joe rejoined The Durning String Band in 1985.

In 1988, The Durning String Band and The Garden State String Band merged. Joe played an integral part in the not so easy task of drafting the by-laws of both bands into one document. This started Joe on a lifelong path of service to our band that continues to this day. There has never been a time since Asti has not served the band in some capacity. Over the years, he has served numerous terms as the music director and the presentation director. He has been the producer for our recordings. He has sat or still

sits on our music, presentation, building, fundraising, by-laws and recruiting committees. Joe is also a fixture on our theme committee, quite often serving as the chairperson.

After the 2009 parade, Joe was unanimously elected as only the 9th captain in Durning's long history. 2026 will be Asti's 17th year as Captain of The Durning String Band! This is a tenure second to only Jim Durning's 20 years as Captain of Durning. Joe had his best finish as captain in 2016 when he placed 5th. While he is proud of this accomplishment, Joe never looks for personal recognition or attention as it is the success of the organization that matters to him.

In 2025, at Durning's 90th Anniversary Gala, Joe was one of five inductees in the inaugural class of Durning's newly formed Hall of Fame. It was my honor and privilege to be chosen to induct my friend. As I stated in his induction speech, "in my 45 years in our hobby, I have never seen an individual give so much of themselves to an organization. He does it all without any fanfare or attention. From running sectionals to giving lessons to new members, from going unannounced to play music for an ailing member in hospice to running up a steep embankment to make sure the senior citizens watching feel included in the parade, from talking to high school marching band members at a standstill in a parade to dancing with toddlers and senior citizens, he promotes the hobby of Mummery wherever he goes".

Joe has been married to his wife Maureen for 37 years. They have 3 beautiful daughters and have recently been blessed with 3 precious grandchildren. Mummery is a family tradition in the Pomante household. All three of Joe's daughters are members of Durning and you can see them every New Year's Day dancing proudly, side by side with their father.

Joe taught himself to play the alto saxophone. He plays whatever role is required of him to make the band sound and look better. Joe sits in at music rehearsals and helps run both accordion, banjo and alto sax sectionals. He works with our members to help them become better musicians and is willing to give lessons to anyone wanting to learn saxophone or accordion.

From day to day, you never know what role you will see Joe filling. At any given time, you can see him playing sax or accordion, building props for New Year's Day, painting scenery, attending dance rehearsals in Pennsauken, helping with drill rehearsal in Magnolia or music rehearsal in Gloucester City. In the weeks prior to New Year's Day, Joe is a whirlwind blowing through the club just long enough to check on things and see what is needed after coming from our seamstress, the hardware store or a trip to New York City to pick up a certain type of fabric that can't be found anywhere else.

Joe is a tireless champion of our hobby. Wherever he goes, you can hear him talking about Mummies, educating those who are not familiar with our hobby and trying to recruit new members into the hobby.

I can honestly state that if it was not for Joe's commitment to The Durning String Band and his passion for Mummery, Durning may have ceased to exist long ago. Joe's positive energy gets everyone excited and invested throughout the year and makes people want to be involved!

As the face of our band, you can often find Asti at other Mummies organizations clubhouses and functions, either representing our band at their open houses or presenting a donation check from our band to various charities. Joe is also willing to help other clubs out as much as possible, whether that means giving them materials that they have run out of, loaning an instrument during a parade to replace a broken one or lending his years of knowledge and experience to help another club succeed.

For his dedication to our organization, his passion for Mummery and his tireless efforts to promote our hobby, The Officers and Membership of The Durning String Band are proud to nominate Mr Joseph "Asti" Pomante for enshrinement in The Philadelphia Mummies String Band Hall of Fame.

2026 Hall of Fame Inductee



Joseph Forster



Please allow me to present, on behalf of The Officers and Members of The James Durning String Band, our beloved member, Joseph Forster for consideration to be inducted in The PMSBA "Old Timers" Hall of Fame.

Joe became interested in music in 1963. He had many cousins who were members of The Polish American String Band and his admiration of them led to Joe taking saxophone lessons. Joe continued perfecting his craft while in high school as a member of the marching band, concert band and jazz band. In October of 1970, Joe joined the Broomall String Band at the request of Johnny Avis. Johnny was Broomall's music director and was also Joe's saxophone teacher.

Joe's first Mummers Parade was in 1971 with Broomall. The theme was titled "Love" and earned Broomall 18th prize. This theme title was quite significant and telling, as a life-long love of being a Mummer had begun. After doing his first Show of Shows in 1971, several members convinced Joe to move with them to The Garden State String Band.

In 1976, Joe transitioned from alto saxophone to tenor. He was gaining a reputation as a musician that anyone would be happy to play with in a jam session. In 1980, Joe heeded the calling to take on a larger role within the band. He was nominated and elected as a trustee officer in 1980.

Joe remained with Garden State until 1988 when The Garden State String Band merged with The Durning String Band. Never one to take a back seat, Joe played a significant role in adapting the combined by-laws of each organization into one document. In 1994, Joe was elected as treasurer and the very next year, he received his 25-year Gold Lifetime Membership Card.

In 1996, Joe was elected as The President of The Durning String Band. These were turbulent times for the band. The City of Gloucester deemed the band's current clubhouse was unfit to stand as a structure. Durning was left without a club, but Joe and the other officers acted quickly and secured other rented practice facilities.

1996 also saw a substantial decline in the membership of Durning. Always the problem solver, Joe presided over the decision to open the membership to females. It was at this time that Durning and The Mummers became a Forster family tradition when Joe's wife JoAnn, his daughter Karen and his son Greg joined the band. Joe was able to hold the band together, keep it solvent and ensure that Durning made its 61st consecutive year up Broad Street. Joe was rewarded for his efforts with a unanimous election to a second term as president in 1997.

Joe took on the role of Financial Secretary again in 1998 and 1999 and again from 2013 – 2015. In 2018, Joe decided to expand on his musical repertoire by joining The Gloucester City "Old Timers" String Band. Sadly, due to physical issues catching up with Joe, after 54 consecutive years, 2024 was Joe's last time in front of the judges on New Year's Day.

Joe continues to indulge in his love of music as a member of The Gloucester City String Band. You can also catch Joe participating in jam sessions at The Durning Clubhouse on any given Wednesday night or Sunday afternoon once rehearsal has wrapped up. One of Joe's favorite times of the year is participating in the jam sessions of Durning Day, where he gets to play with old friends and newer musicians just starting out.

Joe will be the first to tell you how fortunate he is. This long-standing musical hobby that he entered into some 55 years ago has provided him with the opportunity to meet hundreds of people and make life-long, treasured friendships. Joe Forster's life is truly a life filled with music and Mummery.

In closing, The Officers and Membership of The James Durning String Band could think of no finer tribute to reward his many years of leadership and dedication than to nominate Joseph Forster for induction into The Philadelphia Mummers String Band Old Timers Hall of Fame in this, our 90th anniversary year. We thank you for your consideration.

Chris Farr



Chris Farr's contributions to the String Band tradition are nothing short of extraordinary. Chris has written 10 First Prize and thirty-one Top Three musical arrangements in the String Band Division. Those results reflect not only consistent excellence, but also the trust and respect he has earned among his peers.

Chris began his String Band journey with Fralinger String Band alongside his father and brothers, learning the craft and spirit of mummery the way so many of us did—through family, community, and shared tradition. As his musicianship developed, he built a life devoted to music and education. A graduate of the University of the Arts (B.M. 1994; M.M. 1995), Chris served there as Professor of Jazz Studies and Division Head for Instrumental Performance, then moving onto the faculty at Temple University, mentoring the next generation while continuing to elevate the art form we celebrate.

Over the years, Chris has arranged and consulted with nine string bands and created more than 40 thematic musical arrangements for seven different bands. His work stands out for its creativity, adaptability, and deep understanding of what makes a program succeed—musically and visually. He doesn't simply write charts; he helps bring each theme to life, collaborating closely to ensure the final product is clear, compelling, and ready to "hit the street" at the highest level.

Just as important as his talent is his character. Chris is a generous teacher, a valued advisor, and a friend to the String Band community. He has supported young musicians who want to learn the craft of arranging, contributed his insight to judging conversations and symposiums, and consistently shows up with the same spirit that defines the best of mummery: work together to make things more entertaining, impactful - better.

Behind that sustained commitment is also the steadfast support of his family. The time, energy, and dedication required to participate at this level isn't possible without a strong foundation at home, and Chris is fortunate to have a family that believes in this tradition and supports him in the many hours it takes to create, collaborate, and contribute year after year. Their encouragement helps make his continued involvement—and his continued excellence—possible.

For his remarkable achievements, his lasting influence, and his unwavering dedication to our tradition, Chris Farr is richly deserving of induction into the String Band Association Hall of Fame.

John's journey began in 1965, marching with the Avalon String Band at just two and a half years old as a Munchkin alongside his brother Joe. That early beginning grew into a lifelong devotion.

John paid that forward by organizing serenades and benefits, teaching music, assistant musical director and drill director of Broomall String Band and always stepping up when help was needed.

Known affectionately as a true "mum geek," John is an avid historian and collector, preserving the stories and memories of all bands. One of his greatest honors has been marching alongside his three sons, John, Ryan, and Sean Patrick, as well as his sister, nieces, and nephews, keeping this tradition alive through generations.

John proudly played with various bands and found his home as one of Joe's Boys in Ferko String Band. In 2023, John was named Captain of the Joseph A. Ferko String Band - a role which he served for one year. He continues to serve as Recording Secretary, as well as an active playing member of the Ferko String Band.

Not only is John dedicated to this great tradition, he will be retiring in February 2026 from the Philadelphia Police department where he spent 37 years protecting and serving the public. John's heart and dedication to the SBA, Ferko, and our parade ensure that this remarkable tradition will continue for years to come.

Congratulations to a fine gentleman, truly deserving of this prestigious honor.



Lumiere senses that Belle has had enough excitement for the evening and takes her to her bed chamber so that she can freshen up. The Wardrobe has some ideas about what Belle should wear. Lumiere tells Belle “this is how I’d like to Dress You Up”, as he brings enchanted dresses to life.

Upon hearing of Belle’s love of books, Lumiere wants Belle to use her Pure Imagination as he orders a gigantic copy of her favorite book brought out. Belle is shown to the library. The Royal Librarians remind everyone that they are in a library, so they need to Shut Up And Dance With Me.





Theme Concept


